

DYLAN QUINN DANCE THEATRE (NORTHERN IRELAND)

Created through a close collaboration between Dylan Quinn, Jenny Ecke and composer/singer Andy Garbi, Fulcrum has been inspired by Samuel Beckett's play 'Catastrophe' and its relationship to Vaclav Havel. Fulcrum explores the complexity of dependency, control and shifting power balances in a macro context whilst also demonstrating how this affects the micro world we live in. It seeks to touch on the fragile balance of control as well as the insidious nature of power. The performance is a combination of vocal pieces, breath chanting, highly orchestrated music and intricate, concentrated and emotionally charged movement. Fulcrum is part of the development of a body of work by rural-based Dylan Quinn Dance Theatre, which seeks to establish in Enniskillen (Northern Ireland) a unique artistic voice.

Dylan Quinn Dance Theatre creates artistic work that endeavours to say something about the world in which we live. Lead by Artistic Director Dylan Quinn, the company is committed to producing new exciting dance and physical theatre performance work that is informed by the social, political and cultural world around us. Whilst having its physical presence firmly in rural Northern Ireland, the company has national and international focus and strives to create work that communicates and questions.

EMBRACE

AFFARI ESTERI (FRANCE)

EMBRACE IS A CHOREOGRAPHIC JOURNEY THAT PORTRAYS RELATIONSHIPS COMING INTO BEING. A REFLECTION ON THE EXISTENCE OF ONE THROUGH ANOTHER.

Two men face each other, constrained in their search for different forms of identification, embracing poetic stances to investigate their variable relationship: from a lovers' narrative to duplicity, from a social body to a perceptive body. Embrace envisions the other one as a witness, a mirror, a support or a companion. Edmond Russo and Shlomi Tuizer have invited New York poet Christina Clark, and musician Oren Bloedow into the choreographic process. This four-part composition questions the juxtaposition of artistic languages creating a symbolic receptacle for disparate voices. Embrace is a choreographic journey portraying relationships coming into being, and a reflection on the existence of one through another.

Italian-born Edmond Russo and Israeli-born Shlomi Tuizer started their careers respectively in the Lyon Opera Ballet (Fra) and the Batsheva Dance Company (Isr). Their joint journey began as performers for Hervé Robbe (Fra) and Joanne Leighton (Bel), before they cofounded Affari Esteri in France (2004). Their collaboration is based upon a dual approach to the research of movement, related to a social and anthropological discourse.

Paper bubbles is a journey through a fantasy world filled with bubbles of all kinds: paper, soap, digital, balloons, shadows, black light,... Roger is a trumpeter in love with bubbles and other round things. Roger spends night and day trying to unite his passions for trumpet and bubbles, by doing bubbles with the trumpet. But he does not succeed. One day, a dream leads him to Bombalia, the country of the bubbles, where he meets Bumbú the naughty fairy. Bumbú, also likes bubbles. She communicates through movement only, without words. Bumbú spends a lot of time watching humans. When they are sad, when they lose hope or imagination, she comes to bring back their desire to play, laugh, imagine and dance... Seeing Roger's unsuccessful attempts to create bubbles with his trumpet in the real world, Bumbú comes from Bombalia to help him.

Múcab Dans company was founded to produce multidisciplinary performances mixing visual and performing arts. In 2010, Múcab Dans Company created "Pirouette in D minor", a dance, music and multimedia performance. In 2011, "MUT[is]#01", a 20 min. piece investigating the relationship between movement and iron. In May 2013, Múcab Dans premiered "Paper bubbles" in BarcelonaVisual SoundKids program. The company is currently working in a new dance, visuals and structures perfomance that will be premiered in 2015.

TDP'14 FORUM

The Tipperary Dance Platform Forum is a public round table where audiences and artists mingle to discuss practical topics relevant to the making of dance works. A way to demystify the artistic practise, to understand how dancers/choreographers work, and a way to perceive the realities, big and small, that artists are facing day by day.

During the forum, the panel of guest artists from the Tipperary Dance Platform makes a short presentation on the selected topic, before opening the discussion to the audience. Our panellists are:



HÉLÈNE CATHALA (MONTPELLIER, FRANCE)

Dancer with Cie bagouet in the 80's, and with Trisha Brown in 92, Hélène Cathala directed Cie La Camionetta with Fabrice Ramalingom in the 90's, before founding her company Hors-Commerce. She is also co-founder of Festival Mouvements sur la Ville, that has become Montpellier Dance's fringe festival. Hélène is also a renowned dance pedagogue.



ALEXANDRE ISELI (TIPPERARY, IRELAND)

After graduating Master in biology, Alexandre became a professional Dancer in 1993, performing with companies in Switzerland, France, Belgium and Ireland. Since 2008, with Jazmin Chiodi, they developed the Tipperary Dance Residency programme, founded Tipperary Dance Platform, and have created and toured choreographic work as Iseli-Chiodi company.



IRINA MARTÍNEZ (BARCELONA, SPAIN)

Irina, dancer and choreographer, is the Artistic Director of the Múcab Dans company *and* Bàcum/performing and visual arts based in Barcelona. She is graduated in classical dance by the Royal Academy of Dance and has expanded her training in Holland in Henny Jurriëns Stiching Foundation, Amsterdam Dance Center, The Theaterschool, among others.



FEARGHUS Ó CONCHÚIR (IRELAND AND UK)

Fearghus is an Irish choreographer and dance artist whose film and live performances create a space for audiences and artists to build communities together. In order to create layers of meaning in movement, he gathers perspectives gleaned from personal and collective experiences, frequently collaborating with artists from other disciplines.



DYLAN QUINN (ENNISKILLEN, NORTHERN IRELAND)

A professional dance artist for over 17 years, Dylan Quinn founded DQDT, and is interested in creating work that says something about the world within which we live. Following MA studies in Peace and development, he also worked as a lecturer on a Peace and Community Development course and became Artist in Residence with Fermanagh District Council.



EDMOND RUSSO (PARIS, FRANCE)

Italian-born Edmond Russo started his career in the Lyon Opera Ballet (FRA). Performer for Hervé Robbe (FRA) and Joanne Leighton (BEL). Edmond co-founded Affari Esteri with Shlomi Tuizer in 2004. They recently presented works in venues such as Rencontres chorégraphiques de Seine-Saint-Denis, Chaillot National Theater, the National Dance Centre, Paris.



SHLOMI TUIZER (PARIS, FRANCE)

Israel-born Shlomi Tuizer started his career in the Batsheva Dance Company (ISR) before moving to Europe and working with companies including Hervé Robbe (FRA) and Joanne Leighton (BEL). In 2004, Shlomi is co-founder of Affari Esteri with Edmond Russo.

BLANC CASSÉ: UNE CONFÉRENCE DANSÉE

Sharing the fabrication secret of a dance work is the purpose of this very unique performance that first of all exposes the solo *Blanc Cassé* (May 2014), in which Hélène Cathala dances her encounter with Africa. Is it a travel diary? Is it a documentary dance, or a self-portrait? Through music, video documents, photos and body experiences, she explores the arduous way towards another culture. On a second level, Hélène would like to share with the audience some of the many questions raised by this sensitive and strong portrait of a woman «on the run». The dance and the discourse together create a warm *talk-dance-show* that will involve you in the creative process, and allow you to share her artistic universe.

Hélène Cathala danced with Dominique Bagouet and Trisha Brown from 1989 to 1992. In 1993 she co-founded La Camionetta dance company with Fabrice Ramalingom, and created ten dance pieces. In 2006, she founds her company, Hors Commerce, developing both teaching opportunities and creations, such as Slogans, Shagga, Exode 1.25, Talking Blues and La jeune fille que la rivière n'a pas gardée (presented here at Tipperary Dance Platform 2013), in which she affirms her focus on formal choreography and stage composition. In 2013 she was invited to work on cultural exchanges and mixed dance forms in South Africa. Blanc Cassé is her last solo, inspired by this African experience.

An outstanding dancer, co-founder and co-choreographer of company Affari Esteri, Edmond Russo also has a wide experience in dance teaching. He has been teaching on a regular basis for training centres with international recognition, such as CND (Centre National de la Danse) in Paris, Coline professional training centre, and other organisations in France and abroad.

Hélène Cathala teaches the fundamentals underlying her choreographic work, through body explorations, using Body Mind Centering and precise exercises related to her experience as a dancer. She will bring elements helping you to be simultaneously grounded, accurate and fluid, to be conscious of your body volumes and your own architecture, and to create movement by connecting intimate sensations and space awareness. The last part of the class will be dedicated to the teaching of dance vocabulary taken from the most recent company work.
