Presented 63 performances of original dance pieces from 13 countries including Argentina, Canada, Belgium, France, Spain, Portugal, Germany, Italy and more.



We are an artist led, and art focused organisation, grounded in the practice and values of hospitality, community, collaboration and sharing.

The experience, connections, practise and artistic productions of the artistic director as dance artist and choreographer drive, inspire and enrich all aspects of our programme

We invite people to come together in Tipperary to create dance, to perform dance, to think about and develop dance, and to learn dance.

We are a rich network of people that includes school children and teachers, people in local community groups, professional dancers and choreographers in Ireland, and international dancers, choreographers, development agencies and producers.

For us dance is a way of thinking, a way of being, a way of connecting deeply with ourselves, with other people, with ideas, and with the realities of the world we live in.

We share our passion and understanding of dance with our local communities through our work in schools, with community classes and with older people.

- We create original dance performances and dance films.
- We offer a local and international programme of resources and residencies for dance artists.
- We deliver masterclasses mentored by leading international dance artists.
- We celebrate the work with an annual international boutique dance festival.
- We teach and create work in local communities to enrich artistic life and develop audiences.
- We support and advocate for the development of the dance sector
- We commission new work.
- We work with other artists in different disciplines to test and enrich the work.

We are an artist led organisation, constantly searching and experimenting with our collaborators, to discover the most relevant and innovative way to create these opportunities.

"Atypical personalities in a cautious landscape"

Tipperary Dance (previously known as Tipperary Dance Platform and the TDP' International Dance Festival) offer the people of Tipperary, dancers from all over Ireland, and the wider professional dance sector, creative opportunities, practical resources, and deep support.

From 2008 to today, we have developed and delivered an outstanding artistic programme in Tipperary that

- Engages with local and international communities and audiences,
- · Builds and tends deep relationships with local people through our schools and community work,
- Supports professional dancers in Ireland with care, time, resources and money,
- Offers access to a network of international dance artists and dance agencies,
- Raises the visibility of professional dance by positioning County Tipperary as an international centre of contemporary Dance.

In partnership with Excel Arts Centre, Tipperary County Council Arts Office and The Arts Council of Ireland (An Chomhairle Ealaíon), we have developed our original dance residency into a robust infrastructure for engagement, development and performance of dance.

The infrastructure is an innovative framework of bursaries, residencies, international relationships, original performances, classes and a unique, boutique annual Dance festival.

It is a framework that supports the presence of the artistic director in Tipperary as artist and choreographer, to research, create and disseminate work.

It is a framework that understands and responds to the needs of dancers, and strives to create community, combat isolation, and give people time and space to reflect, develop and grow as artists.

It is a framework that understands that dance is a different way of being and a different way of thinking, and strives to give people of all ages and experiences the opportunity to experience their own creative life.


Tipperary Dance is now deeply embedded in an international network of dance artists, organisations and festivals, and has become a national and internationally visible showcase for Irish made contemporary Dance.

Our work, developing dance within the community, fosters public awareness and appreciation of the personal and community value of the arts, and contributes to community life and culture.

Through our commissions, residencies and masterclasses we have created and presented dance works of the highest quality. Work that provokes reflection and interaction through post show talks, symposia, public lectures and the trademark warmth, intelligence and hospitality that characterises all our work.

We promote and champion Tipperary internationally, both through our international touring and through the personal care and attention we offer to all our guests and contributors.

Over the last 12 years we have created a unique space in Tipperary, promoting national and international artistic exchange, developing cultural and artistic diversity by promoting new styles, new practices, intercultural exchanges, and the mixing of different art forms with dance. We have created a home for dance.

In late 2008 Tipperary County Council, working in partnership with the Excel Arts Centre, appointed Jazmin Chiodi and Alexandre Iseli as Dance Artists in Residence at the Excel Arts Centre. This was a daring and courageous act on the part of the Local Authority and the Excel. There was no tradition of contemporary dance in the region and no infrastructure to support its development.

The two dancers responded to the challenge and set about creating the partnerships and programmes that would inject a new vibrancy into the cultural life of the county. They introduced new ideas, new ways of thinking and new possibilities, and created an innovative infrastructure that supported dancers from across the country.

In 2010 the Arts Council of Ireland (An Comhairle Ealaíonn) launched the Dance Artist in Residency Award and used this tool to invest in Tipperary Dance Platform.

In that same year, in an ambitious step, Jazmin and Alexandre launched The TDP' International Dance Festival. In a rural setting with no significant tradition of contemporary dance they built an artist-led and curated festival featuring leading international and national dancers and choreographers. The festival was distinguished by its intimacy, hospitality and scale and established itself as a vibrant networking event, distinguished by the quality and diversity of a programme that brought local and international dancers together to meet, reflect, work, and enliven the communities of Tipperary. They partnered internationally Trois C-L (Luxemburg), Le Grand Studio (Brussels), Compagnie Marie Lenfant (Le Mans), Festival Mouvements sur la Ville (Montpellier), EiMA (Spain), Acción Cultural Española, Tanztendenz (Münich), Tenerife LAV.

The TD' International Festival continues to attract the best contemporary dance artists across Europe, including Tânia Carvalho, Lost Dog, Alexandra Waierstall, Pierre Pontvianne, François Veyrunes, Moritz Ostruschnjak, Christian Ubl, and artists at the forefront of creation in Ireland, including Liz Roche, Oona Doherty, John Scott.

In 2016, the Tipperary Dance Platform programme was acknowledged by the European Dance Network as a case study example on best practice for relevance in the European dance sector.

As they continued to build an innovative infrastructure for contemporary dance in Tipperary they remained true to their core artistic principles: Everyone has a body, and dance is not exclusively a specialists' trade. Nearly three thousand children take part in their Dance in Schools programme, festival workshops or other events. Numerous local groups have been part of the creation of public dance performances, a group of women, some nearly eighty years old, have danced in public and their All Day Do Dance events bring people of all ages and abilities together to dance.

In 2019, Tipperary Dance Platform was nominated for the National Age Friendly Ireland Recognition and Achievement Awards.

Tipperary Dance has created something unique in Tipperary, a home for dance that gives people time, space and support. In Tipperary Dance we understand that we are all bodies in motion, complex, sensitive, filled with contradictions and an endless source for creation and discussion. All our work is about people and we are proud to embrace the great Irish traditions of hospitality, respect, and community that enthuse both audiences and participating artists.

We embrace a vision for a future where the experience of embodiment and public space are vital in our ability for critical thinking, social interaction and civic behaviour.

MAKING A CREATIVE STRATEGY

This strategy emerged from an extended period of reflection and research throughout 2021 made possible by an Arts Council Capacity Building Award.

We had many long meetings and conversations to get to the heart of what we do and who we are; we mapped processes, built business models, stuck notes on a virtual wall, and experienced frustration and anxiety.

Over a period of three months we engaged with people we have worked with over the years: dancers, choreographers, funding partners, audience members, and many more. We listened to what they had to say in an effort to understand what we mean to our community in Tipperary, to our colleagues in the dance community here in Ireland and internationally.

To all of these people we say thank you for the time, the honesty, the support and the advice.

What we understood at the end of this is that we are artists, and we must be true to that: That everything we do, the choreographic work, the planning, programming and curation, the meetings and the logistics, the fundraising and the festival management, we do as artists. We do it with curiosity, with patience, with generosity and care.

We are all bodies in time, and we know that there is a need for what we do, a need for a place to meet remarkable people and see remarkable things, a need for a place away from big cities that is international, a need for a place for people to think, reflect, learn, be challenged, be welcome... and to dance.


Tipperary Dance exists to:


The festival is our annual family celebration
